
# **New Superintendent Hired**

# From the Guidance Office...

It is important to recognize seniors for scholarships that they have been awarded. The awards presented at Honors Night are those we know about. In order to honor all others, seniors need to be responsible for contacting Mrs. • Thompson to inform her of any scholarships received. If she is contacted, no later than Friday, May 20th, she will mention or present those awards. Please don't assume that the Guidance Office is aware of all scholarships. Contact Mrs. Thompson at christi.thompson@monticello.k12.ia.us. Honors Night is scheduled for Tuesday, May 24th at 8:00 PM.

The Iowa Code mandates that all Iowa students must create a plan in 8th grade and complete the required components of the state-designated career information system in grades 8-12. IHaveaPlanIowa is the comprehensive web-based planning tool that assists Iowans as they explore education and career options. An Iowa Guideway has been created for each grade level to assist students and educators through the process; students complete these every year. This provides an easy step-by-step process for students to complete the required components. The 9th, 10th, 11th and 12th graders should have completed the Guideways for this year. Please ask your son/daughter if they have and discuss with them their future plans. Adults can open their own free account as well.

## Important! Important! Important! PARENTS PLEASE READ!

DROPPING OFF AND PICKING UP STUDENTS – Please use crosswalks! The Monticello Community School District urges you to support our priority of student and traffic safety around your school.

At certain times of the day, particularly before and after school, the amount of vehicles and pedestrian traffic around our schools may create congestion. Please leave our bus lane in front of the schools open for unloading and loading buses. Parents who drop off their students at school should be careful to observe the school area speed limit and look carefully for other students walking to school. Please, when picking up or dropping off students at these locations, do not stop in the busy street, and do not block crosswalks or driveways.

At the elementary level, it is suggested that you park near the school and escort your child by foot to your car in safety to/from the bus loading area. When dropping off or picking up students at the middle school, please, please have your child(ren) use the designated crosswalks. Many students are observed bolting in front or behind their parent's car or buses only to be placed in danger of the other traffic.

It is best if parents drop off students or pick students up with the passenger side of the car closest to the building curb so students do not have to cross the street in front of other cars. Safety comes only with vigilance by everyone. Be courteous to your fellow parents and residents. Safe driving improves the safety for all children, including yours.
