Hello everyone,

In this newsletter I want to write about a topic that is a challenge (or will be a challenge) to all of us, teenagers. I have had the opportunity to work directly with teenagers since 1992 when I took my first assistant high school baseball coaching position at Dubuque Senior High School. If I told you that 24 years of working with teenagers makes me understand every teenager, I would be lying. I have known for years that teenagers struggle with understanding their roles in situations and often behave differently around different adults. They can be unpredictable, emotional, and angry at times. Are they different today than when we were teenagers? Or when our parents were teenagers? Consider this quote about teenagers:



"The children now love luxury. They have bad manners, contempt for authority and show disrespect for elders...and they love chatter in place of exercise."

To put this in perspective, this quote came from Socrates about 2400 years ago. This quote could be still used today however there are some changes to society that have had an influence on how are teens operate today.

Let's look at some current trends to get a better idea of what makes a teenager today.

- A generation ago teens tuned in to MTV to watch the latest music videos and get the "411" on fashion. MTV is dying dead (so is the expression "411"). Music is still popular among teens and they listen to many different types of music. Teens download music from iTunes or stream from YouTube, Pandora, or the most popular music site among teens, Spotify.
- 2. In addition to music, Netflix is very popular among teens who will, "binge-watch" seasons or an entire series in a few weeks.
- 3. Facebook is OUT. Teens would tell you that it is for the, "Old People". Teens use Facebook to connect with their parents but they use Snapchat, Instagram, and Twitter to connect with their friends. Snapchat is the most popular social media app for teens. One misconception about teens is that technology replaces people but teens see it as the way to connect people.
- 4. When polled the average the teens received their SMART phone at age 11. Teens spend an average of 6 hours a day on their phones. Teens report that they spend 11 hours a day in front of screens.
- 5. Teens have FOMO (Fear Of Missing Out). That motivates them to connect with friends often. They don't want to be out of the loop when something happens.

Knowing all of this helps a person understand teens a little better but a bigger question is, "How do I connect with my teen?" Here are some suggestions on how you can make that happen.

- 1. Eat Together. Make time to eat as a family as much as you can. Talk about something that is interesting to them and be a good listener. Even if you know their facts are confused. If possible have them cook the meal with you. The kitchen is a great place to bond.
- Share a family interest and create family traditions. In my house we all try and watch the Iowa State Basketball games together. Not only do we cheer together but it gives us something in common we can talk about during the week. My dad used Chicago Cubs baseball games to connect with me. I remember some of our best conversations were related to baseball games.
- 3. Follow your teens lead and become interested in what they are interested in. Create some one-on-one time as you discuss what they want to discuss. Seize the moment when you can.
- 4. Do some good together. Volunteer at your church or in the community doing something that makes you both feel good. Community service is a nice lesson to share with your teen.
- 5. Get to know their friends and welcome them into your home. The better you know your teens friends, the better you know your teen.
- Control your anger and be flexible. In a world where your teen will think they know everything, pick and choose your battles. Remember, their brains won't be fully developed until age 23-25 so sometimes it is no use arguing, you can't beat nature.

Just remember that you are not alone. The drama that comes with teenagers will affect all of us who have children. Just remember to take it one day at a time and know that your wonderful child is still in there...only swimming in hormones and building up the confidence to become the wonderful adult you always knew they would be.

Kindergarten Round Up for students entering Kindergarten in the fall of 2017 is scheduled for Monday, January 9th thru Friday January 13, 2017 at Shannon School from 7:30 AM. to 4:00 PM. At this time parents will be asked to complete some information forms. A health form, dental form, physical form (with lead screening) and immunization card will be provided.

Completed immunizations and a dental exam are required by law for all students entering Kindergarten. Some of the series of vaccines take six (6) months to complete. Start now to make sure all needed immunizations are completed before your child starts school in the fall. 2017-18 Kindergarten students do not need to attend this special Round Up event.

Students must turn 5 years of age on or before September 15, 2017 to attend Kindergarten.

Attention Parents and Guardians:

Winter is upon us! As we are in the season for cold weather, we would like to remind you there is no regularly scheduled adult supervision at school buildings before 7:50 AM. (Exception: Students that ride the shuttle buses may be on the school site (as necessary) prior to 7:50 a.m. and middle school students should not arrive before 7:45 a.m., doors open at 7:50 a.m.) Except in rainy or sub-zero conditions, buildings are generally not open before 8:00 AM.

Please be certain your children are properly attired for colder temperatures with a winter coat, hat, and gloves. Elementary students also need snow pants and boots for recess.

It is also important for bus riders to have proper winter attire. While it has not happened in recent memory, the possibility exists a bus could break down while on a route. As such it is important the children be warmly dressed in case a bus break down occurs.

Finally, especially for elementary and middle school students, please mark your child's name on their coat, gloves, and hat.
