#### Statewide Voluntary Preschool Programming for Four-Year-Old Children

For 2017-18, we are expecting to receive state funding to support preschool programming for four-year-old children. Here are some Frequently Asked Questions to help community members gain a better understanding of what this preschool funding means to Monticello.

Which preschools are partners in the MCSD Program? Little Panthers Preschool (Shannon Elementary), Mother Goose Preschool (St. Matthew Church), and Sacred Heart Preschool (Sacred Heart School)

**How will the funding be used?** There are many assurances (i.e., requirements) that need to be met when using preschool funding. Money will be spent to make sure that these assurances are met. The assurances include (but are not limited to):

- Facility requirements including accessibility and playground guidelines
- · Costs associated with teacher and paraprofessional professional development and certifications
- Increasing hours of preschool instruction
- Paying staff costs for required instruction, program operation, home visits, family nights, and parent/teacher conferences
- Supplies and Equipment

Which children will this funding support? Funding must be used to support children that turn age four on or before September 15<sup>th</sup>.

**Will my four-year-old receive free preschool?** Little Panthers Preschool is a full day program. The program will be 4 full days with a max tuition of \$135.00. Mother Goose Preschool (M-Th, 8:00 am-11:00 pm) and Sacred Heart Preschool (M-Th, 8 am - 11 am or 12 pm - 3:10 pm) are ½ day programs, and they are free.

**Will my four-year-old receive transportation to and from preschool?** The school district may be able to provide free transportation using an existing bus route. Check with your preschool provider for more information.

#### Registration?

All three programs are currently taking applications for the 2017-18 school year. To increase your chances of securing a slot, apply to the programs by February 28<sup>th</sup>, 2017.

#### School Lunch Accounts—Reminder!

You can check balances and deposits and see what your child is eating each day on your account in the School Dining System. This system will send automatic email reminders when your family's account balance is getting low, once you set your 'low balance warning'.

Please ensure you have a valid email address (under <u>CONTACT 1</u>) within PowerSchool in order to receive these reminders.

NOTE: Lunch fees/balances are not available in PowerSchool, only in the School Dining/Total Access program.

Also, if you have a negative balance in your lunch account you are not allowed to purchase any food or drinks from the ala cart. We will be giving any student that has a negative balance of \$20.00 or more, a brown bag lunch. This lunch will include a cheese sandwich, baby carrots, and a carton of white milk. Please check your family's lunch account and make sure you have a positive balance.

## Middle School Geography Bee

8th grader Bo Kramer won the school-level competition of the National Geographic Bee on January 17, 2015 and a chance at a \$50,000 college scholarship. Bo will take a written test to be submitted for scoring. Up to 100 of the top scorers in each state will be asked to compete in their state bee, which takes place on March 31, 2017. The winner of the state bee will earn a trip to Washington, D.C. for the national championship rounds. The winner of the national competition will win a \$50,000 scholarship, a lifetime membership in the National Geographic Society, and a trip to the Galapagos Islands, courtesy of Lindblad Expeditions and National Geographic.

The top ten school finalists to compete included the following students 5th graders John Welter and Kyle Cox, 6th graders Dylan Ponder and Jacob Miller, 7th Graders Elise Kehow, Nathan Oswald, and Eian Weber, and 8th graders Brooklyn Stark, Lauren Bader, and Bo Kramer. Lauren Bader earned 2<sup>nd</sup> place.

A big thank you goes out to local groups, businesses, and individuals who donated various items so that the finalists would have a small prize. Thank you to Citizens State Bank, Wolken Dental, Dutrac, Blue Inn, B.E. Fitness and Training Center, La Hacienda, Pizza Ranch, and Carrie Steger. I would also like to thank Deb Bowman for acting as the master of ceremonies for the event.

Do you know your geography? Anyone can brush up on geography with the GeoBee challenge, an online geography quiz at <a href="https://www.nationalgeographic.com/geobee">www.nationalgeographic.com/geobee</a>. It poses ten new questions a day from previous geography bees. You can also download an app with more than 1,000 questions from past Bees, "National Geographic Bee Challenge" for your iPhone, iPod touch or iPad; from the Android Market; or for Nook Color.

All 5<sup>th</sup> through 8<sup>th</sup> grade students at the middle school participated in the preliminary rounds of the bee in their social studies classes to attempt to be finalists.

## **Open Enrollment Timelines**

Parents/guardians considering the use of the open enrollment option to enroll their child/ren in a public school district in the State of Iowa other than their district of residence should be aware of the following dates: March 1, 2017— Last date for regular open enrollment requests for the 2017-18 school year. September 1, 2017- Last date for open enrollment request for entering kindergarten students. In order to qualify for open enrollment after the March 1st deadline, the student must meet the "good cause" definition for the 2017-18 school year. Good cause relates to: (1) There is a change in district of residence due to: family move, change in marital status, foster care, adoption, or treatment program; (2) Participation in foreign exchange program; (3) Failure of negotiations for reorganization or whole grade sharing; (4) Loss of accreditation or revocation of a private charter school; (5) Pervasive harassment; (6) severe health (determined by the district). If these circumstances occur after March 1, a parent or guardian may file a "late" open enrollment application. Parents/guardians of open enrolled students whose income falls below 160% of the federal poverty guidelines are eligible for transportation assistance. This may be in the form of actual transportation or in the form of a cash stipend. Parents should be aware that open enrollment may result in the loss of athletic eligibility for students in grades 9-12 for varsity competitions for the first 90 school days of transfer. Children will remain on open enrollment status unless the parent/guardian decides to cancel it or the agreement is terminated as a result of the parent/guardian moving, by not sending the child to the requested district or any other circumstance that results in the pupil no longer attending the receiving district.
