## 2015-16 Mother Goose Preschool Registration Information

Mother Goose Preschool will enroll children for 2015-16 beginning February 1st. Applications will be available at Mother Goose Preschool. Tuition for three-years-olds is \$95 per month. A Statewide Voluntary Preschool allocation may cover the tuition for children who are four by September 15th. Watch the February issue of the *School Spirit* for additional information.

## Openings are available for Sacred Heart Preschool for the 2015-16 school year.

If you are interested, please call Sacred Heart at <u>319-465-4605</u>. We have two sections of 3 year-olds. One is M & W from 8:00-10:50 am and the other is T & Th from 8:00-10:50 a.m. That tuition is \$90 per month. If your child turns four by Sept. 15, 2015, tuition is paid by the State of Iowa. If your child is five, tuition will be \$120/month. This program also has two sections. One is 8:00-10:50 a.m. M-Th and the other is 12:00-2:50 p.m.

## 2015-16 Little Panthers Preschool Registration Information

Openings in the Little Panthers Preschool are available for 2015-16. If you are interested in registering your three or four year old, applications will be available from the Shannon School office on February 1st. Preschool openings are filled through a lottery method; once your child is enrolled, you may retain a spot for the following year-if your child is not moving to kindergarten. If your child was on the waiting list for 2014-15, you must reregister in February of 2015. Tuition is tentatively set at \$370/month and this includes: breakfast, lunch, milk and snacks. If your child turns four by September 15th, a Statewide Voluntary Preschool allocation may lower your child's tuition to \$170/month. More information will be available in the February issue of the *School Spirit*.

## <u>2015-16 Kindergarten Round Up Scheduled</u> Kindergarten Round Up for students entering kindergarten in the fall of 2015 is scheduled for Wednesday, January

7th & Thursday, January 8th at Shannon School from 9:30 AM. to 4:00 PM. At this time parents will be asked to complete some information forms. A health form, dental form and immunization card will be provided. Completed immunizations and a dental exam are required by law for all students entering kindergarten. Some of the series of vaccines take six (6) months to complete. Start now to make sure all needed immunizations are completed before your child starts school in the fall. 2015-16 kindergarten students do not need to attend this special Round Up event. Students must turn 5 years of age on or before September 15, 2015 to attend kindergarten. If you have any questions, please call Sandy Hinrichs at 465-5425, ext. 4114.

## **Attention Parents of Seniors!**

If your son/daughter is planning to attend college, you need to apply for financial aid. The 2014-2015 FAFSA (Free Application for Federal Student Aid) will be available beginning January 1, 2015, and your student's FAFSA needs to be completed **BE-FORE** the school's financial aid priority deadline. Each school has their own deadline so be sure to check this out. College Goal Sunday is a national program that works with community organizations to coordinate financial aid events where students and families can receive free assistance with the completion of the FAFSA. In our area, it will be held on Monday, February 23rd at JREC (Jones Regional Education Center) from 3-9 p.m. Kirkwood reps will take walk-ins but appointments may be made by calling 465-2302.
