Hi everyone,

This spring has been such a challenge for our sports activities with the weather. In some ways it feels like they are just getting started. The reality is that in a few weeks they will be coming to an end. Summer sports will be starting soon and there is traditionally an overlap between spring and summer sports. Combine that with our band lowa Bandmasters Association performance, Graduation, FFA, BPA, day-to-day class-room activities, and final exams....our students are not coasting into the end of the school year.



Thank you to everyone that participated in the parent survey this spring. We also did a staff and student survey. These results will be used by building leadership teams to analyze and set some school improvement goals for the upcoming school year. Your participation and honesty about our schools is greatly appreciated. Our surveys are a good opportunity to connect everyone to the process of school improvement. We will continue to conduct these surveys each spring, so if you missed it this school year I hope you can participate next time.

I take a lot of pride in the work our staff does to challenge our students but I also know from time to time people can have concerns about what is going on in the schools. I wanted to share with everyone the procedure of how to address concerns when they arise. It is always better to address concerns rather than let them grow into frustration with the school. So here is some information I think you will find helpful if you ever have a concern.

If you have a concern about something going on in the school district, please take the first step and go directly to the person it involves. For example...it may be a teacher, coach, or bus driver. Going directly to the source will solve the majority of issues in the most practical way. If you do not receive an answer or explanation that makes sense, then the second step is to go directly to their most direct supervisor. That may be a principal or the Athletic Director. Then, if you are not satisfied with their answer or explanation, the next step should be to take the concern to the Superintendent. If you are not satisfied with that answer you would then contact the Superintendent and request that the Board give your concern some consideration. Then the Superintendent and the Board president will discuss the issue and decide if it should be on a board agenda or if the decision of the Superintendent will be final.

I want people to feel comfortable coming forward if there is a concern. Our staff will listen and respond in a professional manner. The people working in our schools are invested in the success of the children in this community. It has to be a united effort to help our students navigate through school and into college or a career. We all have to be on the same team to make this happen.

IMPORTANT!

-BEFORE SCHOOL STARTS IN AUGUST ALL KINDERGARTEN, 7^{TH} , and 12^{TH} grade students must have their respected <u>immunizations</u> per state LAW.

-ALL KINDERGARTEN AND 9TH GRADE STUDENTS MUST HAVE A CURRENT <u>DENTAL SCREENING CERTIFICATE</u> ON FILE. <u>All Kindergarten students</u> must be up to date on their preschool shots and have received their 4-year-old boosters of Dtap, Polio, MMR, and Varicella.

<u>All 7th grade (and above) students</u> must show proof of having received a Tdap (Tetanus/Acellular Pertussis) vaccination booster AND a Meningococcal vaccination on or after 10 years of age.

<u>All 12th grade students</u> must show proof of receiving 2 DOSES of Meningococcal vaccine; or 1 dose if first dose was received at 16 years of age or older.

<u>All Kindergarten and 9th grade students</u> must have a current, within the past 12 months, dental certificate on file.
