Strategic Operating Plan update. After collecting a lot of information from the school board, the administrative team, teachers, and parents we were able to identify some key areas of focus in the development of a Strategic Operating Plan for the Monticello Community School District. Our key areas are Communication, Safety, Technology, Facilities, Budget, Curriculum, Assessment, Instruction, and Professional Development. Next, we will narrow these areas and create an action plan for each area. Then we will create measures of success on each of the action steps and a timeline to complete the action steps over a three year period. It will take some time to put this plan together completely but we are well underway in the process.

Moving into the winter months means the possibility of inclement weather. Just so we are all on the same page here is what you need to know to be in the communication loop when we have delays, cancellations, or early dismissal. First, we will be up early checking on the roads and hope to make a decision by 6am. Remember that is our goal and some mornings can be more complicated with weather approaching. We will contact our district leadership team right away when we make a decision to delay or cancel school. Then we will send out a message on school messenger, post the information on our website and facebook page, contact weather sites such as KCRG to post the information, notify drivers, coaches, etc... This means that you should get some information around 6:30am. If you have a child that attends Panther Academy please remember that Panther Academy may still be open even if school was cancelled. They will only shut down under extremely poor weather conditions. If you want to receive a text message when school is delayed or cancelled please remember to update your contact information in PowerSchool or at your school site if needed. Then you will receive a school messenger text with the information. If you are already receiving school messenger texts then your cell phone information is up to date.
