Many people have been working very hard to get several projects going this fall. I wanted to share some of them with you. One important committee we have started is a district technology committee. This committee will be tasked with identifying what skills we want our students to have when they graduate from Monticello High School. Then we can identify the environment that has to exist in order to achieve that goal and make a plan to get there. That will result in a three year technology plan which will focus our time, energy, and money in one direction.

Another important committee we have started is a district facility projects committee. This is not about building new school buildings, it is about creating a plan for the special projects we have that will maintain the buildings and facilities we currently have. We have identified many projects that need attention and the committee will examine each project and establish an estimated cost. Then the committee will prioritize each project and make a five year plan to complete the needed work. This plan will not only prioritize what is important but create a plan to keep our district in the best shape that it can be.

The district technology committee and the facility projects committee will become a part of a bigger district plan. We will be developing a "Strategic Operating Plan" for the Monticello Community School District over the course of this school year. The idea is to identify areas of focus and develop an action plan with a timeline, who is responsible, and how we will measure success in those areas to strategically implement the mission of the Monticello Community School District.

## The mission of the Monticello Community Schools, a district striving for educational excellence, is to prepare students through challenging experiences, to be caring, productive, creative citizens, who will be life-long learners.

We have already started collecting data that we can use to develop a Strategic Operating Plan from the Governing Board, the administrative team, a teacher committee, and a parent committee. This will take some time to complete this process but the result will be a three year plan that will focus our attention where it needs to be focused.

#### KCRG-TV9 TEXT Alerts—a note from KCRG!

Effective Monday, September 19, KCRG-TV9 is ending its text alert service for its closings and cancellations system.

Instead, KCRG-TV9 is now offering push notifications through the KCRG News app, available in the i-Tunes and Google Play. Users will be able to sign up to receive a notification on their smart phone anytime you enter an alert into the KCRG system. It is the same essential function as our text alert service

Here's how you can alert your students, parents or staff to sign up: If you already have the KCRG-TV9 News App, make sure the update is downloaded (most will automatically update). Once the updated app is installed, open up the settings section by tapping the gear icon in the upper right hand corner. You should see an option for closings alerts. Tapping on that option, you will be able to search for a district by name, county or even zip code. Then turn on the button for the school(s) for which you want to receive notifications. That's it. Once a school you've selected issues a closing or delay, you will get a push alert on your phone instantly. If you have any questions or concerns, do not hesitate to reach out to KCRG staff for help.
