Hello everyone,

Welcome to fall everyone!!! Now that we are in the school routine it is time to address school attendance. There is a lot of current research on attendance and how it relates to student performance in school. Most of the research revolves around students that are, "Chronically Absent" which by definition is being absent 10% of the days in a school year, or the equivalent to just two days a month. Chronic absenteeism in kindergarten can predict lower test scores and retention in later grades, especially if the problem persists for more than a year. Current research also finds that children who are chronically absent in kindergarten and 1st grade are far less likely to read proficiently at the end of 3rd grade. When students get older chronic absenteeism is also related to a higher dropout rate among students. In lowa, an average 8.3 percent of public



school students were chronically absent in the 2015-16 school year, according to the lowa Department of Education.

What can you do? It all starts with building regular routines for bedtime and the morning. Don't permit missing school unless your child is truly sick. Avoid medical appointments and extended trips when school is in session. Talk about the importance of regular attendance and about how your child feels about school. We want your child to feel connected to the school so they want to go everyday. If there are other circumstances that cause your child to miss school and you need help, please contact your child's school for assistance.

In September, the School Facilities Committee met to begin looking closely at our school facility needs. Several facts have risen to the surface and there are three key themes that the committee will be discussing. The first is the **cost** associated with the facilities and any future facility considerations. Second is the idea of **repairing current facilities vs new buildings**. Third is the idea of a **central campus plan vs multi campus plan.** The committee is just getting started so stay tuned and I will continue to give updates from the School Facilities Committee in future months. In the mean-time here are a few facts to think about...In 1924 a new school was built (Now the Middle School) at a cost of \$200,000. In 1996, a bond passed in Monticello to build a high school for \$8.85 million dollars. In 2012, FEH Associates did a facility study of Monticello schools and indicated that Shannon, Carpenter, Central Middle School, and the bus barn would cost the district \$20.3 million dollars to do needed repairs and meet current ADA standards (that was five years ago)...that amount did not include repairs at the high school. Just food for thought!!!

It is my pleasure to share that our two new school board members, Craig Stadtmueller and Mandy Norton, have been sworn in and attended their first school board meeting on September 25th. I am very excited that both Craig and Mandy are willing to volunteer their time to make our district the best that it can be. In addition, Bud Johnson was elected President of the school board and Dave Melchert was elected Vice President. The committee assignments for the 2017-2018 school year are: John Schlarmann (Buildings/Grounds & Transportation), Dave Melchert (Negotiations and Labor), Craig Stadtmueller (Education), and Mandy Norton (Finance). This group has a lot of work ahead of them this school year but I know they are up to the task.

An important first step in the financial aid process is completing the FAFSA, the Free Application for Federal Student Aid. Beginning last year, students should complete this as soon as possible after October 1st. The first step is to create a FSA ID
