Scholarship Overview

At least one scholarship of \$1000 will be awarded to an outstanding student who is pursuing a career in agriculture. Fields of study may include, ag education, communications, production, research or any other area involved with the agricultural industry. The purpose of this program is to identify and encourage talented and thoughtful students who will emerge as industry leaders.

Scholarship funds will be awarded to student after completion of their first year of college.

All scholarship applicants will be awarded a paid three year membership to the lowa Cattlemen's Association.

Conditions of Eligibility

Applicants must be a graduating high school senior.

Applicants must demonstrate a commitment to a career in the agricultural industry through classes, internships, or life experiences.

Applicant's parent(s)/guardian(s) must be a paid member of the Jones County/Iowa Cattlemen's Association.

Applicants must be enrolled as an undergraduate student in a two or four-year institution of higher education for the entire 2016-17 academic year. Proof of enrollment as a full-time student will be required to receive the scholarship money.

Judging Procedure

All applications received will be handled as follows: applicants names will be removed, applications will be forwarded to a cattlemen's judging committee outside of Jones County, and will be evaluated solely on the criteria outlined on the application.
