- Hills Bank and Trust Company Leadership Grants are available to high school <u>JUNIORS</u> residing in or attending schools in Benton, Cedar, Iowa, Johnson, Jones, Keokuk, Linn, Louisa, Muscatine, or Washington counties in Iowa.
- Hills Bank and Trust Company employees and their children are not eligible.
- Applicants will be evaluated on their involvement in Community Service and Student Group Activities, Work Experience and their High School Academic Information, which includes a grade point average of 2.8 or higher.
- The recipients of this grant, applying during their junior year of high school, will agree to attend a minimum of nine hours of Hills Bank® sponsored Leadership Training during their senior year.
- Each applicant will need to:
 - 1) complete the online Hills Bank and Trust Company Leadership Grant Application,
 - 2) upload a copy of their most current, complete high school grade transcript
 - 3) <u>TWO</u> signed letters of recommendation—one from a community member, employer, or volunteer **AND** one from a school teacher or academic advisor.
- <u>Application material must be submitted online no later than 11:59 PM March 1, 2017 to be</u> considered.

- Completing training and proving eligibility, the subsequent scholarship is available to recipients attending any of Iowa's accredited colleges, universities, or community colleges.
- Each scholarship will total \$1,000 to be paid the fall semester of the qualifying recipient's first year of college.

<u>Helpful Hints</u>

- 1. Be sure to complete all information requested
- 2. Complete the Student Group Activities, Community Service, and Work Experience. Include all appropriate activities.
- 3. Financial assistance Include sources such as parents, employment, other scholarships, financial aid, etc.
- 4. Leadership Comments This is where you tie it all together and expand on the activities listed in earlier sections. Tell how you were a leader for or gave leadership to the activities you listed.
- 5. Include current, complete grade transcript (include Fall 2016 grades/classes). If college courses were taken in high school and are not listed on the uploaded high school transcript, upload a separate list of courses taken with known grades, or upload a copy of college transcript(s) or student grade report(s). Copies DO NOT need to be official. NOTE: Multiple transcripts can be uploaded on a single application form.
- Letters of recommendation Confide in your references specific information that will help them more effectively support your leadership grant application. (Ask ONE academic advisor such as a high school instructor, guidance counselor, advisor, or principal <u>AND</u> ONE community member or volunteer to be your reference.
