From the Bureau of Labor Statistics (released June 2017):

In 2016, only 17.9% of people with disabilities had jobs. In comparison, 65.3% of their nondisabled peers were employed.

How have Iowa TAP Programs helped close this gap?

During Federal Fiscal year 2016,
73% of TAP participants in Iowa
left the program gainfully
employed.

TAP is an alliance between Monticello Schools, Midland Schools, and Iowa Vocational Rehabilitation Services.

What is Vocational Rehabilitation? Vocational Rehabilitation (VR) is a federal/state program that helps people with disabilities obtain and maintain jobs.

VR is committed to helping people with disabilities find meaningful careers.

- TAP is a results-driven program with a focus on assisting students with disabilities becoming career and college ready.
- The optimal goal for each TAP student is employment, whether that is directly out of high school, or after completing their post-secondary training.
- TAP is a year round program that follows the student after graduation until they reach the age of 25.
