The John W. Kortemeyer Art Scholarship is offered to graduating seniors who are interested in continuing their education in an art-related field. John W. Kortemeyer was an art teacher in the Monticello Community School District when he died in a tragic snowmobile accident in 1982. John was a dedicated art teacher who understood the importance of supporting students in their creative endeavors.

The scholarship amount varies. The presentation of this award is made at Senior Honors Night and is presented by a member of the John W. Kortemeyer Scholarship Committee.

Additional information about the scholarship:

- 1. The scholarship selection is made by the Kortemeyer Scholarship Committee.
- 2. The scholarship winner(s) will be selected based on artistic achievements and goals. The recipient will exemplify strong, positive character and the promise for future success in their selected artrelated field of study. Selection is not weighted to favor high academic achievement. However, a minimum grade point average of 2.0 is required.
- 3. Selection of the recipient will be made without discrimination as outlined in the Monticello Community School District Board policy and regardless of the applicant's relationship with the Kortemeyer Scholarship Committee.
- 4. The recipient may attend a 2 or 4 year program at a college, university or technical school in an artrelated program.
- 5. The student must present school bill or enrollment form to the Monticello School District Foundation to receive the payment. Deadline to present this information is March 1st of the following year after the student's graduation.
- 6. The scholarship will lapse if the recipient fails to enroll at the beginning of the semester or fails to remain in school as outlined in paragraph 4 above.
- 7. If the recipient is not eligible to receive the award or does not make claim to the award at the beginning of the first semester following graduation, the award will be rescinded and no money will be given.
