IMPORTANT!

-BEFORE SCHOOL STARTS IN AUGUST ALL KINDERGARTEN, 7TH, AND 12TH GRADE STUDENTS MUST HAVE THEIR RESPECTED IMMUNIZATIONS PER STATE LAW.
-ALL KINDERGARTEN AND 9TH GRADE STUDENTS MUST HAVE A CURRENT DENTAL SCREENING CERTIFICATE ON FILE.

All Kindergarten students must be up to date on their preschool shots and have received their 4-year-old boosters of Dtap, Polio, MMR, and Varicella.

All 7th grade (and above) students must show proof of having received a Tdap (Tetanus/Acellular Pertussis) vaccination booster AND a Meningococcal vaccination on or after 10 years of age.

All 12th grade students must show proof of receiving 2 DOSES of Meningococcal vaccine; or 1 dose if first dose was received at 16 years of age or older.

<u>All students in grades 7-12</u> interested in participating in sports must have a current physical and concussion form on file.

As the temperatures start to get warmer, please encourage your students to bring a water bottle to school with them so they can stay hydrated. Thank you!

Parents of next fall's seniors:

Senior (and baby) pictures for yearbook are due December 18 of your senior year. Plan ahead to take them over summer break. This allows you to have it done ahead of time, avoiding the rush and stress near the deadline. Senior year can be a very busy time. Plan now to make it easier. See guidelines below:

Senior Photo Guidelines for Yearbook Portrait:

- head and shoulders only
- vertical format
- clothing should conform to school dress code
- no inappropriate poses
- no other people, animals, objects/props in photograph
- no sunglasses
- color or B/W are acceptable
- submit digitally or write name on back if submitting a hard copy.
- must be received by deadline (Dec. 18)

Of course, you are free to have any senior photo poses you wish for your own use. However, the senior portrait selected and submitted for use in the school yearbook must meet the above guidelines.

Baby photos are optional but must also be submitted by December 18 if you wish one. Copies are preferred to original heirloom photos. Baby pictures not submitted digitally should be labeled on the back with first and last name. Thanks!

Seniors Experience Real Money, Real World

While underclassmen completed required state testing last month, our seniors engaged in a financial literacy program entitled Real Money. Real World. Molly Schmitt and Jacki Luckstead from Iowa State University Extension, students engaged in budgeting instruction that prepared them for future financial decisions. Through four lessons, seniors learned about paycheck deductions, money management

provided through institutions, how career choices and education level affect income, the expenses of maintaining a household, costs to raise a child, and how financial decisions affect spending opportunities. After

this preparation, thanks to ISU Extension and fourteen community volunteers, seniors engaged in a simulation where they made lifestyle and budget decisions as a 27 year old adult. While some students completed the simulation with smiles and money left over, other seniors experienced time in a simulated iail after buying a car and not purchasing car insurance.


