Hi everyone,

Our seniors graduated last weekend and we are all very proud of them. It is always so fun to see them with that “graduation swagger” and sense of accomplishment. We all wish them the best going forward and expect great things from this group. I want to say THANK YOU to our senior parents for supporting your students through their years in the Monticello Community School District. High school is not always easy and it comes with sharp turns, mountains, and valleys. All of those challenges and successes are part of growing into a person that is ready for the next step in life.



In addition to graduation, we have so many other things going on. If you have noticed the high school property is starting to change. They have moved the Portzen Construction trailer out there, marked off utilities, and have fenced in the construction area. Next, they will be moving some of the utilities and begin to build some entry roads. They will need to bring in about 2,000 loads of fill to raise the foundation of the new middle school to the correct height. When high school softball ends we will take anything that we can reuse on the fields and then that area will be graded. The softball field parking lot will be fenced off and used as a staging area for supplies. We are setting up a camera in the back of the high school to capture pictures of the project as it unfolds. The same camera will be used for a live feed so our community can see the construction happening through our school district website. If the weather cooperates our target completion date is still August 1, 2020. This summer we will also continue the “Summer Food Program” offered at the Monticello Middle School from June 11 - August 9 and at Shannon Elementary June 10 - August 9. This program provides free lunch to children and teens age 1-18. At the middle school it runs from 11:30-12:15 each day and at Shannon Elementary it runs from 11:15-12:00 each day. Parents can also eat for a small charge (\$3.00) every day. There are no strings attached to this program. Anyone can eat every day and no registration or identification is required. So please take advantage of this community program.

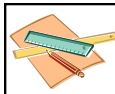

## IMPORTANT!

-Before School starts in August all kindergarten, 7<sup>th</sup>, and 12<sup>th</sup> grade students must have their respected **immunizations** per state law.

-All Kindergarten and 9<sup>th</sup> grade students must have a current **Dental screening certificate** on file.

All Kindergarten students must be up to date on their preschool shots and have received their 4-year-old boosters of Dtap, Polio, MMR, and Varicella.

All 7<sup>th</sup> grade (and above) students must show proof of having received a Tdap (Tetanus/Acellular Pertussis) vaccination booster AND a Meningococcal vaccination on or after 10 years of age.

All 12<sup>th</sup> grade students must show proof of receiving 2 DOSES of Meningococcal vaccine; or 1 dose if first dose was received at 16 years of age or older.

All students in grades 7-12 interested in participating in sports must have a current physical and concussion form on file.

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**Annual Notice-Reporting Child Abuse** (Board Policy #403.0)

In compliance with state law and to provide protection to victims of child abuse, incidents of alleged child abuse should be reported to the proper authorities. All district employees are encouraged, and employees who constitute mandatory reporters pursuant to state law are required, to report alleged incidents of child abuse that they become aware of within the scope of their professional duties.

When an employee who is a mandatory reporter suspects that a student is the victim of abuse, the employee shall notify the Iowa Department of Human Services, orally or in writing. If the employee believes the child is in immediate danger, the local law enforcement agency shall also be notified. Within forty-eight (48) hours of an oral report, the employee shall file a written report with the Iowa Department of Human Services.

The district shall arrange for employees who are mandatory reporters to complete a two-hour training course relating to the identification and reporting of child abuse within six months of initial employment, unless the employee submits evidence that he/she has completed the required course within the previous five years. This course must be retaken at least every five years.

It is also the policy of the district that all employees are required to report to the level one investigator any suspected cases of physical or sexual abuse of students by district personnel.

**Annual Notice—Use of Video Cameras on School Buses** (Board Policy #702.11)

The Monticello Community School District Board of Directors has authorized the use of video cameras on school district transportation. The video cameras will be used to monitor student behavior to maintain order on school transportation to promote and maintain a safe environment. Students and parents are hereby notified that the content of video recordings may be used in a student disciplinary proceeding. The content of video recordings may be confidential student records and, if so, will be retained with other student records. Video recordings will only be retained if necessary for use in a student disciplinary proceeding or other matter as determined necessary by the administration. Parents may request to view video recordings of their child if the video recordings are used in a disciplinary proceeding involving their child.
