Hello everyone,

We have just started the second semester and it seems like the first semester went by so fast. We have so many things happening in the Monticello Community School District, which is probably the reason the year seems to be going so fast.

First up, we are about six months away from the completion of our grade 5-8 middle school. Everything seems to be going so well up to this point. The project included a \$1.2 million dollar contingency for unexpected items and as of this date we still have about \$1 million left in that contingency account. At this time they are working on closing up the building and getting it heated so

they can complete the inside work. Hard to believe but in some areas they are already putting up drywall. The entrance to the high school has started to take shape. If you get a chance to drive by and look at the front of the high school you will see the framework for the new entrance and that will give you an idea of what that will look like.

Next, we have been working very hard over the last year to put together a new five-year Strategic Operating Plan (SOP) for 2019-2024. The plan has been finalized and will go to the school board for approval. When approved this plan will be the blueprint for the work we need to do in the Monticello Community School District for the next five years. The plan was developed through the input and feedback from parents, students, staff, the school board, and the administrative team. The areas of concentration for the SOP are: School Facilities, Communication, Teaching & Learning, and School Environment & School Climate.

Next, we have also been working very hard on a new school website. We are hoping it is ready to "go live" in a few weeks. The new website is a response to the collection of information from students, staff, and parent groups and should be easier to navigate by phone or other handheld devices. The new website will give easy access to both the school and activity calendars, have more one-button access to our most frequently visited areas, and be iPhone friendly.

Finally, as we transition into the new middle school the most common question is, "what are you going to do with the old middle school?". The school board is exploring options at this time such as making modifications to the old building to keep the gym and warehouse space. In order to make these decisions we will need to work with an architect/ engineering firm to help us explore options and pricing. So at this time we are waiting on a Fee Proposal for this architectural/engineering work.

If you get a chance, please come out and support our winter athletic teams. There is always excitement in the air when the teams are playing well. Our basketball, wrestling, and bowling teams have a chance to do well in the postseason this year, so jump on the Panther bandwagon and show your support for our student-athletes.

Open Enrollment Timelines

Parents/guardians considering the use of the open enrollment option to enroll their child/ren in a public school district in the State of lowa other than their district of residence should be aware of the following dates: March 1, 2020—Last date for regular open enrollment requests for the 2020-21 school year. September 1, 2020- Last date for open enrollment request for entering kindergarten students. In order to qualify for open enrollment after the March 1st deadline, the student must meet the "good cause" definition for the 2020-21 school year. Good cause relates to: (1) There is a change in district of residence due to: family move, change in marital status, foster care, adoption, or treatment program; (2) Participation in foreign exchange program; (3) Failure of negotiations for reorganization or whole grade sharing; (4) Loss of accreditation or revocation of a private charter school; (5) Pervasive harassment; (6) severe health need (determined by the district). If these circumstances occur after March 1, a parent or guardian may file a "late" open enrollment application. Transportation assistance is available for those who qualify according to income guidelines between contiguous districts. This may be in the form of actual transportation or in the form of a reimbursement. Parents should be aware that open enrollment may result in the loss of athletic eligibility for students in grades 9-12 for varsity competitions for the first 90 school days of transfer. Children will remain on open enrollment status unless the parent/quardian decides to cancel it or the agreement is terminated as a result of the parent/guardian moving, by not sending the child to the requested district or any other circumstance that results in the pupil no longer attending the receiving district. Statewide Voluntary Preschool Programming for Four-Year-Old Children

For 2020-21, we are expecting to receive state funding to support preschool programming for four-year-old children. Here are some Frequently Asked Questions to help community members gain a better understanding of what this preschool funding means to Monticello.

Which preschools are partners in the MCSD Program? Little Panthers Preschool (Shannon Elementary), Mother Goose Preschool (St. Matthew Lutheran Church) and Sacred Heart Preschool (Sacred Heart School).

How will the funding be used? There are many assurances (i.e., requirements) that need to be met when using preschool funding. Money will be spent to make sure that these assurances are met. The assurances include (but are not limited to):

- Facility requirements including accessibility and playground guidelines
- · Costs associated with teacher and paraprofessional professional development and certifications
- Paying staff costs for required instruction, program operation, home visits, family nights, and parent/teacher conferences
- · Supplies and Equipment

Which children will this funding support? Funding must be used to support children that turn age four on or before September 15th.

Will my four-year-old receive free preschool? Mother Goose and Sacred Heart are half day programs and are tuition free. Little Panthers Preschool is a full day program and has a max tuition of \$135.00. All three programs runs Monday through Thursday.

Will my four-year-old receive transportation to and from preschool? The school district may be able to provide free transportation using an existing bus route. Check with your preschool provider for more information.

Registration? All three programs are currently taking applications for the 2020-21 school year.
