Hello everyone,

As we begin the month of November we have some really fantastic things going on in our school district. Going through classrooms each week it is easy to see students engaged in learning in each school building. Students are discussing important topics with the teacher and each other. They are researching information to create opinions and better understand multiple topics. They are constantly using technology to collaborate and explore new ideas and concepts. Exciting times in the Monticello Community School District!!! Outside of the classroom, our students are engaged in a lot of activities such as speech, drama, music, and sports. It never ceases to amaze me how busy our students are each day.



Over the next few weeks we will host Parent-Teacher Conferences in each school. Please bring your child to these conferences and include them in the dialogue with the teacher. When students are active participants in Parent-Teacher Conferences they learn to be more assertive and better understand how to be advocates for their own education. Please plan on attending Parent-Teacher Conferences on November 5 or 7. It is always nice to hear about the success and challenges your child may have from the professionals who spend over seven hours a day with them. Remember the goal of Parent-Teacher Conferences is a partnership between home and school to educate your child in the best way possible.

During the month of November our construction project will continue to move forward. One big question I have heard a lot more recently is, "Are they still on time with the new building?" The answer is YES. The project is still on time and over the next few weeks they will be finishing the metal on the outside of the high school, adding metal to the roof areas of the new building, and installing the prefabricated concrete walls in various areas around the building. It is really starting to take shape.

The softball fields are really coming along. In the sports complex at the west diamond we are completing our dugouts, clubhouse, and press box. We are also finishing the fieldwork and the concrete work around the west diamond. It is really looking great. We are not able to install our stadium seats until spring, however they tell us they will be installed before our first game. At the Shannon site the new field is nearly complete. Some fencing has to be completed along with some fieldwork. We will still be adding sidewalks and a restroom to the concession stand however the field should be ready for game play next spring/summer.

One last topic, from time to time you may have a concern with something going on at the school. I encourage you to go directly to the source to resolve the concern. I have found that many times in the past a problem can easily be resolved with a conversation directed to the appropriate person. Following that conversation if you are not satisfied with a resolution, please then take it to the next level, such as a principal or athletic director. I want you to feel comfortable enough to ask real questions if you have real concerns in our school district. The Monticello Community School District is a wonderful school district and good communication will help keep it that way.

Freshmen Explore Local Career Opportunities

High School Students Interested in NCAA Sports

Here is a quick overview of the NCAA Eligibility Center process to help guide student-athletes and ensure they are ready for college sports. Students are responsible for maintaining their academics throughout high school. These tips will help keep them on track for meeting academic initial-eligibility standards:

Grade 9

• Students work with their counselor to ensure they take appropriate NCAA core courses.

<u>Grade 10</u>

• Students register with the NCAA Eligibility Center at eligibilitycenter.org.

Grade 11

- Students work with their school counselor to ensure they will graduate on time with the required number of NCAA core courses.
- Students take the ACT or SAT and submit their scores to the NCAA Eligibility Center using code 9999.
- Students ask their counselor to upload their official transcript to the NCAA Eligibility Center at the end of the year.

Grade 12

- Students complete last NCAA core courses.
- Students take the ACT or SAT again, if necessary, and submit their scores to the NCAA Eligibility Center using code 9999.
- Students should apply to the school of their choosing and confirm they have been accepted.
- Students request final amateurism certification beginning April 1 before enrolling in college in the fall.
- Students ask their counselor to upload their final official transcript with proof of graduation to the NCAA Eligibility Center.
