Hi everyone,

Over the last several weeks we have been giving tours of the new middle school to many community groups. These tours went right up until the start of the school year. I hope you had a chance to look through the new middle school and see some of the spaces and designs that we have been working on for the last two years. I am so pleased with how the building has turned out and I hope you are too. Most of the comments I have received have been positive and most commented on things like the classroom spaces, entry areas, murals, exterior of the building, gym, library, music rooms, etc. It has all come together so well.

Also, you may already know that our Return to Learn Plan was approved by the school board on

July 27 and rolled out to the community the next day. We have had to make some very tough decisions along the way but safety for the students and staff has been the main focus. For students that are returning for in-person learning, there are several considerations they will need to keep in mind as we begin the school year.

- 1. <u>ALL</u> parents will need to take their child's temperature before they send them to school. If your child has a temperature over 100.3 then keep them home.
- 2. If your child is displaying symptoms of the COVID 19 virus please keep them home. Also make sure to update your child's emergency contact information so we can use it in the event they are not feeling well and need to go home.
- Face coverings on school busses and in buildings will be <u>required</u> for all students and staff. This can be a mask, bandanna, or face shield. Face coverings will become optional when participating in PE, lunch, recess, and after school athletic programs.
- 4. If you can transport your child to and from school it will limit their exposure to other students on the bus. Even though the rides are sometimes only for a few minutes, reducing exposure is one way to limit the spread of the COVID 19 virus.
- 5. We will be opening up all buildings by 7:30am each day in case parents need to drop their students off a little early. There will be supervision and breakfast available before school.
- 6. Please send your child to school with a water bottle and hand sanitizer if possible. We will have hand sanitizer at every entrance but a personal hand sanitizer would be best.
- 7. Please remember our school calendar changes. The first week of school from August 24 28 we will only be meeting in-person from 8-12 each day. In the afternoon teachers will be providing online lessons for all students. In addition, each Wednesday starting September 2 will be an online learning day. No in-person learning will take place those days and every student is expected to participate.
- 8. Participation in online learning is required for all students. Unlike last spring, online learning is required for every student.
- Each day we will be cleaning extensively. Our custodians will clean playground equipment, restrooms, cafeterias, classrooms, and in general everything students can touch. On Wednesdays, we will do extra deep cleaning with no students in the buildings.
- 10. Finally, we will begin the sports seasons with the following changes for spectators. In football, we will be creating a designated area behind each goal post for fans to sit in lawn chairs. This area is not standing room only because standing will block the vision of other fans. We will also block off every other row of the football bleachers. These changes should allow us to have enough social distance outside to create a safe environment for all. In volleyball, we will also close every other row of seats for our fans and require a face covering when in attendance at all times. We will not be using our pep band during home events. There will be more information published about cross country as we get closer to hosting a home meet.

We have worked very hard to make plans to have a football, volleyball, and cross country season. Our athletes are required to follow strict rules of participation according to the state. We ask our fans to be flexible and to remember that these changes are not forever and if we all do our part we increase our odds to not have a COVID 19 outbreak in our school and jeopardize our students learning time or athletic participation.

"Same Storm, Different Boat"

Since March, we've all dealt with the uncharted waters of the storm known as COVID-19. While we sometimes hear "we're all in the same boat" the phrase "same storm, different boat" is a more fitting description of how we've come through the last 5 months. Our experiences through this storm may have been vastly different: different circumstances, different experiences, different perspectives. While we've all experienced COVID-19, we haven't experienced it in the same ways.
