Hi everyone,

That is so much better than many districts around us. Some, because of the derecho and snow days, are not ending until the second week of June.



Even with all of the complications related to COVID this school year I feel like we have really had a good year. Students and families have been given the option for in-person or online learning and even though we had to bring some online learners back at the end of the first semester, those that are still online seem to be doing really well. In-person learning (after we have evolved from continuous health related changes) pretty much looks like it has in the past. With the exception that we are all wearing masks. We are planning an outdoor learning activity at the elementary this spring, we have had our annual ski trip at the middle school, and at the high school our student leadership organizations have been working hard to help the community.

School facilities are continuously being improved on a big and a small scale. Currently we are working on several projects: exploring solar power as an option to lower energy costs, adding lighting to the new softball parking areas, pricing out a digital marquee for the front of the HS/MS complex, updating our camera systems at Shannon elementary, repairing our road around the HS, repurposing a pavilion to be placed next to the tennis courts (the pavilion was previously at the old softball fields), and in general just taking good care of all the things we have related to our buildings and grounds.

As we close in on the end of the year it is always fun to see our kids get excited about the summer. The closer and closer the summer gets; each building begins to become a buzz of excitement. I would really appreciate it if you would take a little time to talk to your child about "Finishing Strong" this year. Just like in a race, the last lap is an important one. There are many important milestones we need to pass before we finish at every grade level. Just a short conversation explaining that before they start to celebrate, they need to finish the race, would be very helpful.
