Hi everyone,

WE ARE BACK...and we are off to an amazing start for the 2021-2022 school year. By the time you read this we will have completed the first few weeks of the school year. When I walk into classrooms I see some amazing student centered learning going on at every level. Each classroom is filled with thoughts and ideas and it is exciting to see students engaged in a variety of classroom activities.

We also have some really exciting facility decisions to make this school year. First, what is going to happen to the old middle school? We will make a final decision by Spring Break. Second, we are exploring options to bring solar power to our district. This would create an annual savings of \$230,000 - \$330,000 for the school district. We are in the process of getting our project approved by Alliant Energy and hope to have final approval by January 2022. Finally, we are exploring options to remodel or rebuild the district Transportation Center. This is in the early stages but the school board has started the planning process.

I want to share with everyone that we have a very important election coming up on November 2, 2021. In this election we will be electing three school board members to four-year terms. A school board member has an important role in the success of a school district. This is a non-partisan, volunteer position. The reward for being a school board member comes from the opportunity to provide an important service to the community. A second item on the ballot will be to update our "Revenue Purpose Statement" in the Monticello Community School District. This can only be done through voter approval. The Revenue Purpose Statement currently allows the school district to spend the funds raised by the penny sales tax (SAVE account) in any way that lowa law allows. This will expire in 2029. Since passing our Revenue Purpose Statement in 2017 the penny sales tax has been extended in lowa through 2050. This extension causes us to pass a new Revenue Purpose Statement so we can spend those dollars as allowed by law from 2029-2050. The approval of this measure will not increase taxes, it would renew the current Revenue Purpose Statement language, so we can continue to make decisions on spending the SAVE account locally, even after 2029. In 2017, this measure passed with overwhelming approval from our community and I am hopeful that our community will support this issue again.

2021 School Board Election

The 2021 School Board Election is set for Tuesday, November 2, 2021. Three seats are up on the Monticello Board of Education. Members are elected to serve four-year terms. The first date to file nomination papers with the Board Secretary is August 23. The candidate filing deadline is 5:00 pm Thursday, September 16, 2021. All nomination materials and info are available online on the Iowa Association of School Boards website, the Iowa Secretary of State website, or at the District Office. School board candidates must obtain 46 signatures to file nomination papers and must live in the boundaries of the Monticello Community School District.

- submit digitally or write name on back if submitting a hard copy.

Help Your Child Succeed in School: Build the Habit of Good Attendance

School success goes hand in hand with good attendance. Did you know:

- •Starting in kindergarten, too many absences can cause children to fall behind in school.
- •Missing 10 percent (18 days a school year) makes it harder for young students to learn to read and drastically affects older students' academic success.
- •By 6th grade, absenteeism is a key predictor that a student may drop out of high school.
- •By 9th grade, regular and high attendance is a better predictor of graduation rates than 8th grade test scores.
- •Students can be chronically absent even if they only miss a day or two every few weeks.
- •Attendance is an important life skill that will help your child graduate from high school and achieve success in whatever postsecondary option they choose.

What can families do to support student attendance?

- Make school attendance a priority. Establish the expectation that your child attends school every day.
- Help your student with regular daily routines. For younger students, this could include things like laying out clothes
 the night before and putting the backpack in the same place so it's easy to find in the morning.
- Keep open lines of communication with your child's teachers. Use PowerSchool notifications to help monitor attendance with older students. (Contact District Help Desk for assistance in setting this up if needed.)
- Seek help from your child's school counselor, other parents, or community agencies if you're having trouble getting your student to school.
