# **High School Students Explore Careers**

This fall our high school students had opportunities to consider career options. On Tuesday, October 19 our 10<sup>th</sup>-12<sup>th</sup> grade students participated in a college and career fair in our high school gym. Students practiced their networking skills to gain information about future possibilities. 95% of students gained new career information from this event.

Freshmen students in English I engaged in career development topics such as

creating an elevator pitch about why they should be hired, networking skills, ca-



reer clusters, and employability skill self-evaluation. The culminating activity was a hands-on career fair sponsored by Junior Achievement. Students were exposed to career professionals from all 16 career clusters through engaging activities.

Completed immunizations and a dental exam are required by law for all students entering Kindergarten. Some of the series of vaccines take six (6) months to complete. Start now to make sure all needed immunizations are completed before your child starts school in the Fall 2022-2023.

Students must turn 5 years of age on or before September 15, 2022 to attend Kindergarten.

General education four-year-old preschool openings are filled through a lottery method. The program includes: breakfast, lunch, milk, and snacks. If your child turns four years old on or before September 15, a Statewide Voluntary Preschool allocation will lower your child's tuition. This program also serves six Head-Start slots and special education students (for both three and four-year-olds). - Become agitated or irritable

- Limit TV and video games youth who are stressed need physical activity and exercise
- Remember routines keep in mind that disruption in routines may cause additional stress.


