The First Friday Breakfast Club (FFBC) is an educational, non-profit group for gay, bisexual, and transgender men. Monthly meetings provide members and guests an opportunity for education on community affairs from local, state, and national opinion leaders and provide them with positive images of the gay community.

As a part of its educational program, FFBC awards \$3,000+ scholarships to Iowa high school seniors who have demonstrated leadership in efforts to increase education and understanding of lesbian, gay, bisexual, and transgender (LGBTQ+) issues and to reduce homophobia in their schools and/or communities.

An applicant must be a resident of Iowa and plan to pursue post-secondary education. Scholarships are awarded without regard to gender, race, religion, creed, marital or employment status or gender/sexual orientation of the prospective recipient or his/her relatives. Additionally, there is no restriction on the type or location of the educational institution where post-secondary education is pursued.

Applications and transcripts must be submitted by email no later than March 15, 2022. The FFBC Scholarship Award Committee will notify recipients no later than April 15, 2022.

- Have you ever been arrested or charged with anything other than minor traffic offenses? Explain.
