




- ⇒ <u>All Kindergarten and 9<sup>th</sup> grade students</u> must have a current Dental screening certificate on file.
- ⇒ All Kindergarten students must be up to date on their preschool shots and have received their 4year-old boosters of Dtap, Polio, MMR, and Varicella.
- ⇒ All 7<sup>th</sup> grade and above students must show proof of having received a Tdap (Tetanus/ Acellular Pertussis) vaccination booster AND a Meningococcal vaccination on or after 10 years of age.
- ⇒ All students in grades 7-12 interested in participating in sports must have a current physical and concussion form on file.
- ⇒ All 12<sup>th</sup> grade students must show proof of receiving 2 DOSES of Meningococcal vaccine; or 1 dose if first dose was received at 16 years of age or older.

#### <u>Asbestos Notification</u>—(Annual Notice)

#### How to Avoid the Summer Slide

For the past several decades, researchers have documented a phenomenon that they call Summer Slide. The theory is that over the summer break, students may lose some of what they've learned during the school year. Researchers have suggested a number of simple ways in which students can keep their brains active during the summer months:



CONNECTION

- Weekly visits to the library. Often, libraries offer free summer activities and librarians are always willing to suggest books.
- Workbooks. Have some workbooks available for down time—waiting for swim lessons or batting practice, on a long car ride, or when you hear those dreaded words "I'm bored".
- Educational media. Find some educational apps, games or shows.
- Field trips. Do research on vacation destinations, show them the route and teach some geography.
- Family connections. If you have an opportunity to slow down and engage with kids, this is a great time to teach new skills and complete activities together—gardening, cooking, home repairs, building projects, etc.
- Summer school or tutoring. Struggling students can get a lot of help from these programs to enrich and accelerate learning.
- Encourage writing. Letters, emails, journal entries, poems for the fridge–any writing is a great way to practice grammar skills, learn new vocabulary and practice developing logical structure.
- Stay active. A healthy body promotes a healthy mind.
