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Hi everyone,

The 2022-2023 school year is underway! It is always so very exciting when the students and staff come back to begin the school year. First day of kindergarten, first day at the new middle school, first year of high school, or the start of senior year are just a few of the first day of school highlights. We moved to a new student information system this school year and that should make it easier to see grades, especially at the high school. You should have registered with the new system during registration and more information will follow in the next few weeks on how to access your student's information. It is a lot more user friendly and I am sure you will like it more than PowerSchool.

Why are my kids so tired at the beginning of the school year? Oh my gosh it is so common for the kids to be wiped out at the start of the school year. If they are crashing after school or going to bed early that will wear off in a week or so. Please make sure they are eating enough and drinking plenty of water. Try and establish new routines now so when the homework starts (for the older kids) they have already made the adjustment. I will also remind you of how important reading is for students. In fact, pick up a book or a newspaper yourself and model that behavior for them. Reading is a life skill that leads to success in school and beyond. If your child likes to read, encourage that development. If they do not like to read, experiment with a genre that they can get on board with. Younger students can read aloud to you or you can take turns with your child reading. I remember reading the book, Harry Potter and the Chamber of Secrets with my daughter when she was in elementary school and we passed that book back and forth so much. I really enjoyed that 30 minutes with her every night and I am sure she did too. Don't miss an opportunity with your kids.

So many exciting activities are starting at the middle school and high school as we begin the school year. Drama, Speech, Marching Band, Volleyball, Football, Cross Country, Cheer, Student Council, NHS, and Interact Club are several of the activities Monticello has going on right now at the high school. Please encourage your child to get involved in something...there is so much research on students that participate in school activities. They are more organized, get better grades, do better on standardized tests, have better attendance at school, and they establish stronger relationships with peers. WOW. All that is pretty good stuff. I would highly encourage you to talk

to your child about getting involved at school.

Help Your Child Succeed in School: Build the Habit of Good Attendance

School success goes hand in hand with good attendance. Did you know:

- Starting in kindergarten, too many absences can cause children to fall behind in school.
- •Missing 10 percent (18 days a school year) makes it harder for young students to learn to read and drastically affects older students' academic success.
- By 6th grade, absenteeism is a key predictor that a student may drop out of high school.

CONNECTION •By 9th grade, regular and high attendance is a better predictor of graduation rates than 8th grade test scores.

- •Students can be chronically absent even if they only miss a day or two every few weeks.
- Attendance is an important life skill that will help your child graduate from high school and achieve success in whatever postsecondary option they choose.

What can families do to support student attendance?

- Make school attendance a priority. Establish the expectation that your child attends school every day.
- •Help your student with regular daily routines. For younger students, this could include things like laying out clothes the night before and putting the backpack in the same place so it's easy to find in the morning.
- •Keep open lines of communication with your child's teachers. Use Infinite Campus notifications to help monitor attendance with older students.
- Seek help from your child's school counselor, other parents, or community agencies if you're having trouble getting your student to school. Source: attendanceworks.org

New High School Credit Academic Probation (Board Policy #502.4)

Board Policy #502.4-Student Attendance and Instructional Time was revised and approved on August 10, 2022. The full policy can be found on our website, but one of the most important changes is the High School Credit Academic Probation section (see below). If you have any questions, please contact High School Principal Nick Schauf.

If a student accumulates a total of ten (10) absences (excused or unexcused) per semester in any course, the student will be placed on "Academic Probation" for that course. A meeting will be scheduled with the parents/guardians, student, and principal (or designee) to create a Success Plan to improve attendance and academic performance for the remainder of the semester. Students will continue to attend the course and submit all coursework. At the end of the semester, any course completed by a student on Academic Probation will be reviewed by a school committee. The school committee will make the final determination if course credit will be awarded to the student.
