Meeting Notes:

- 1. Welcome

- 2. District Current Data: Robyn went over district and grade level FAST and MAP data
 - a. FAST scores
 - b. MAP scores
- 3. Small Group Discussion of Data: groups analyzed and discussed the current and past FAST and MAP data
- 4. Whole Group Sharing of Discussion
 - a. District Data from this Meeting Outcomes:
 - i. Going Well: Increases from Fall to Winter, we are moving in the right direction since COVID
 - ii. Areas to Improve: keep improving to get back to pre-COVID scores and better, continue to make growth to increase the percentage of students at benchmark
 - b. Data and Information from November 30, 2022 Meeting
 - i. Top areas the committee scored from this meeting and the November meeting are as follows:
 - 1. 9 votes for focusing on moving students from proficient to advanced with ISASP
 - 2. 6 votes for improving student to student relationships based on Conditions for Learning
 - 3. 6 votes increasing the attendance rate, especially for the high school
 - 4. 4 votes for focusing on bully prevention and respect

- 3 votes for continuing to make enough growth to increase the percentage of students who are at benchmark on FAST and MAP
- 6. 3 votes for facilities, especially elementary building and gym space
- 7. 3 votes for continuing to increase caring and dedicated staff
- 8. 2 votes for more opportunities for parent involvement
- 9. 1 vote for continuing to increase student engagement in classrooms
- 10.1 vote for continuing improving students from not yet proficient to proficient
- 11. 1 vote for continued communication to stakeholders
- 12. 1 vote for giving more of a voice in decision making by students
- 13. 1 vote for increasing standards referenced reporting understanding for stakeholders
- 14. 1 vote for continuing to increase communication of student learning and teacher feedback
- 15. 1 vote for focusing more on emotional safety
- 16. 1 vote for focusing more on physical safety
- 5. Recommendations to the School Board: The committee decided to combine some of the areas listed above to create these recommendations.
 - a. High quality instruction and increased student motivation to improve the number of students who meet benchmarks and perform at the proficient and advanced levels on assessments.
 - b. Provide opportunities and structures for better student to student relationships, especially in regards to bullying and respect.
 - c. Implement strategies and systems to increase the attendance rate at all buildings, but especially at the high school.
