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Hi everyone,

Well it is June and the summer of 2023 has arrived. We have several things going on in the Monticello Community School District over the summer. Summer Panther Academy will be starting the week after school gets out. We have accepted record high numbers into Panther Academy. This summer we will have over 94 kids!. Most of the summer will be at both Shannon and Carpenter schools except for a short time when they are replacing some carpet at Carpenter. Summer Panther Academy is packed full of summer activities for our kids. They have several day trips planned and you can bring your child daily or only a few days a week.

Drivers Education will start right away in June. This should be completed around the first week of July. Drivers Education will be a little different again this summer. The coursework will be completed online and the driving will be in person. We had real success with the online component last summer so we are doing the classwork online again.

We will be hosting a K-3 Summer School (August Academy) this summer and it is scheduled to begin and run for two weeks in August. It will be a "kick start" program which will help our students get ready for the upcoming school year. A letter will be sent out to families if your child qualifies for summer school. Last summer was the first summer we ran the "kick start" program and we are excited to offer this again to our K-3 students.

What are some things you can do this summer to help your child continue to advance academically? Read, Read, Read... there is so much research out there on how important reading is to students' success. In fact, if you only do one academic activity all summer, make it be reading....A LOT! If your child is younger, read aloud. Read part of the page and let them finish. They will really enjoy reading to you, and you will be surprised how much they will improve if you do that every day. If your child is older, work out some rewards for reading books during the summer. Set some goals and find something that will motivate them. Ice cream is a great reward, but so is having some one-on-one time with mom or dad. Playing games or just hanging out with them as a reward can also be a great motivator. Just be creative and keep them interested.

IMPORTANT!

⇒ Before School starts in August <u>all</u> <u>Kindergarten</u>, 7th, and 12th grade <u>students</u> must have their expected immunizations per state law.



- ⇒ <u>All Kindergarten and 9th grade stu-</u> <u>dents</u> must have a current Dental screening certificate on file.
- ⇒ <u>All Kindergarten students</u> must be up to date on their preschool shots and have received their 4year-old boosters of Dtap, Polio, MMR, and Varicella.
- ⇒ <u>All 7th grade and above students</u> must show proof of having received a Tdap (Tetanus/ Acellular Pertussis) vaccination booster AND a Meningococcal vaccination on or after 10 years of age.
- ⇒ <u>All students in grades 7-12</u> interested in participating in sports must have a current physical and concussion form on file.
- ⇒ <u>All 12th grade students</u> must show proof of receiving 2 DOSES of Meningococcal vaccine; or 1 dose if first dose was received at 16 years of age or older.

X Reminder to register for Kindergarten next year!

Kindergarten Registration for students entering Kindergarten in the fall of 2023 is now open! At this time parents will be asked to use the electronic registration form to create their student in Infinite Campus: <u>23-24 New Student Online Registration</u>. This form is located on the school website: <u>https://www.monticello.k12.ia.us/</u>. Go to Schools>Shannon Elementary>Downloads>Kindergarten/New student letter, online registration form, and mandatory forms. (do not use an incognito/private browser)

Completed immunizations and a dental exam are required by law for all students entering Kindergarten. Some of the series of vaccines take six (6) months to complete. Start now to make sure all needed immunizations are completed before your child starts school in the fall of 2023. Print off these additional forms and present them to Sandy Hinrichs, Shannon Elementary School Secretary. Forms included: IDPH Dental Screen, IDPH Vision Screen, Iowan Migrant Parents Form (everyone must fill out), Home Language Survey, and physical form. These forms are located in the downloads folder on our website under Shannon School.

There are some items that you will need to download, fill out and turn into Shannon Elementary by the time your child starts school. You may drop them off at the school, email them

to <u>sandy.hinrichs@monticello.k12.ia.us</u> (in the subject give the full name of your child) or mail them to: Shannon Elementary School, 321 W South St., Monticello, IA 52310. We look forward to meeting your child!

GUIDELINES FOR SENIOR PHOTOS FOR YEARBOOK

- vertical format
- clothing should conform to school dress code
- no inappropriate poses
- no other people, animals, objects/props in photograph
- no sunglasses
- color or B/W are acceptable
- submit digitally (preferred) or write name on back if submitting a hard copy.
- must be received by deadline (before winter break of senior year)



Annual Notice-Reporting Child Abuse (Board Policy #403.0)

In compliance with state law and to provide protection to victims of child abuse, the board believes incidents of alleged child abuse should be reported to the proper authorities. All district employees are encouraged, and employees who constitute mandatory reporters pursuant to state law are required, to report alleged incidents of child abuse that they become aware of within the scope of their professional duties.

When an employee who is a mandatory reporter suspects that a student is the victim of abuse, the employee shall make an oral report of the suspected child abuse to the Iowa Department of Human Services within 24 hours of becoming aware of the abusive incident. If the employee believes the child is in immediate danger, the local law enforcement agency shall also be notified. Within forty-eight (48) hours of an oral report, the employee shall file a written report with the Iowa Department of Human Services.

The district shall arrange for employees who are mandatory reporters to complete a two-hour training course relating to the identification and reporting of child abuse and dependent adult abuse within six months of initial employment, unless the employee submits evidence that he/ she has completed the required course within the previous three years. This course must be retaken at least every three years.

It is also the policy of the district that all employees are required to report to the level one investigator any suspected cases of physical or sexual abuse of students by district personnel.

Annual Notice—Use of Video Cameras on School Buses (Board Policy #702.11)

The Monticello Community School District Board of Directors has authorized the use of video cameras on school district transportation. The video cameras will be used to monitor student behavior to maintain order on school transportation to promote and maintain a safe environment. Students and parents are hereby notified that the content of video recordings may be used in a student disciplinary proceeding. The content of video recordings may be confidential student records and, if so, will be retained with other student records. Video recordings will only be retained if necessary for use in a student disciplinary proceeding or other matter as determined necessary by the administration. Parents may request to view video recordings of their child if the video recordings are used in a disciplinary proceeding involving their child.
