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Hello everyone,

We have been very busy in the Monticello Community School District. We have just completed Parent Teacher Conferences at each school, we have been reviewing our survey results from students, staff, and parents, we are preparing for the upcoming ISASP testing in April, and our School Facility Committee has been meeting to consider a plan for a new elementary school.

Here are some of the biggest questions I have been getting over the last month...

When is the last day of school this year? The answer to this is still unknown. The schools have done 12 hours of virtual learning which can wipe out two of the make-up days. In addition, we have some banked hours we did not use this winter and the school board could decide to use some of those hours to forgive some additional snow days. So it is entirely possible that we could still end on May 22 as scheduled. We will know the answer after the board meeting on April 22 and I will communicate that out as quickly as possible when we know the actual end date.

What are these "Tax Cards" we are receiving in the mail? These cards are now a requirement of the state through legislation last spring. The school, the county, and the city all list their anticipated tax rates for the upcoming year. The school tax rate is an estimate as the state did not settle on the money they will give the schools until last week. The idea behind these cards was transparency but they have seemed to lead to some confusion for taxpayers. If you are interested in the school budget there is another public hearing scheduled for April 22 at 6pm in the boardroom at the high school and you are welcome to attend.

Where are we at with an Elementary School Bond issue? The School Facility Committee has completed its work on this and now we will bring a recommendation to the school board on April 22. The school board will then discuss and they will have the opportunity to call for a bond election if they are in agreement with the plan. If the board calls for an election the school bond issue will be put on the ballot in the November election. If this is something the board decides to do, I will be getting a lot of information out about an Elementary School Bond. I will use the time after April 22 if the board calls for a bond election through November 5 to educate our community members on facts of this project.
