## Official Minutes of the Monticello Community School District Board of Education for the Regular Meeting of May 19, 2025

The Board of Education regular meeting was held on Monday, May 19, 2025 in the Board Room at 850 E Oak Street, Monticello, Iowa, and was called to order at 6:01 pm by President Craig Stadtmueller. Board Member Tony Amsler led the Pledge of Allegiance and read the Monticello CSD mission statement. Board Secretary, Judy Hayen, did roll call. Camera! Prevention! PSA Competition through Iowa State University; the 8th grade girls track team that placed 1st and the 7th grade on placing 2nd at West Branch. Kenya Davis-Robinson also broke her long jump record at 16' 3.5". The 7th & 8th grade boys also took first place at West Branch. Congratulations to Landry Schauf for breaking the 10-flight hurdle record; our Music Department has received the Best Communities for Music Education Award from The NAMM Foundation for the 4th year in a row!! Congratulations to Nick Thumma, Donna Wall, Ellen Ellis, Brett Kniess, and Tony Butterworth! Principal's Reports (Elementary/Middle School/High School); BPA members who competed at the National Leadership Conference a few weeks ago. We had several students that just missed the opportunity to be recognized on stage for top 10 - those included River Smith, Royce Kiburz, and Ella Sauser. All the students did a great job in their competitions and were great representatives of Monticello High School BPA. Those students attending and competing at NLC included: Mace Schnoor, Lydia Ahrichs, River Smith, Roth Schnoor, Grant Gassman, Ella Sauser, Dawson Naylor, and Royce Kiburz; the MS girls track at the RVC North Conference meet, the 7th graders placed 3rd and 8th graders placed 2nd. Kenya Davis-Robinson set the RVC North 8th grade long jump record at 16' 1" and the 100m 8th grade girls school record at 13.16. Mary Grace Lyons set the RVC North 8th grade 800m record at 2:31.72 and 1500m record at 5:13.01 (1500 is also an 8th grade girls school record). And the 4x100 8th grade relay set an 8th grade school record at 54.59 and placed 2nd. Relay runners were Emerlynn Wright, Kayla Arduser, Joria Jacobs, and Kenya Davis-Robinson.
