We have officially made it to February! It's hard to believe, but in just four short months many of us will be planning cookouts, mowing the lawn, shopping for new baseball or softball cleats, and celebrating the end of another school year. These next four months will fly by, and before we get there, we still have important work ahead of us.

First, construction on the new elementary school is officially underway. Crews are currently raising the ground level and completing initial infrastructure work so that once the ground thaws, they can begin work on the foundation. By April, we anticipate seeing noticeable progress on the site, and we are excited to watch this project continue to take shape.

Second, the second semester is now in full swing, and there is a great deal of learning taking place between now and the end of the year. We are fortunate to have an outstanding staff that thoughtfully and systematically works through each concept, standard, and lesson. Instruction is delivered at a high level, with teachers collecting daily feedback on student progress and adjusting to meet a wide range of learning styles. Lessons are reinforced through meaningful discussions, projects, and hands-on activities. Simply put—miss a day and miss a lot. When students are healthy, consistent attendance is incredibly important.

Finally, we are in the early stages of developing our next Strategic Operating Plan. Survey data has been collected, and the next step will be assembling stakeholder groups to help identify key priorities for the district. This process will take place throughout much of the spring semester, with the goal of completing the plan by June.

## Summer Driver's Education



Monticello High School will offer one session of summer driver's education. An informational letter and registration form will be available in the middle school and high school offices on Monday, February 9, 2026. Space may be limited. Applications will be considered on a first come first served basis. Return the registration form to the High School Office by Friday, March 6, 2026. The cost is \$340.



The summer session is scheduled to start approximately Tuesday, May 26, 2026 and will conclude approximately Wednesday, June 24, 2026. Both the start and end dates may be adjusted if there is a change to the school calendar due to adverse winter weather. The classwork will be done online. There will be a student/parent meeting in May to sign up for the online class and schedule driving times. Students must have a permit to be enrolled in the class.

## Statewide Voluntary Preschool Programming for Four-Year-Old Children

For the 2026-2027 school year, we are expecting to receive state funding to support preschool programming for four-year-old children. Here are some Frequently Asked Questions to help community members gain a better understanding of what this preschool funding means to Monticello.

**Which preschools are partners in the MCSD Program?** Little Panthers Preschool (Shannon Elementary) and Sacred Heart Preschool (Sacred Heart School).

**How will the funding be used?** There are many assurances (i.e., requirements) that need to be met when using preschool funding. Money will be spent to make sure that these assurances are met. The assurances include (but are not limited to):

- Facility requirements including accessibility and playground guidelines
- Costs associated with teacher and paraprofessional professional development and certifications
- Paying staff costs for required instruction, program operation, home visits, family nights, and parent/teacher conferences
- Supplies and equipment

**Which children will this funding support?** Funding must be used to support children that turn age four on or before September 15.

**Will my four-year-old receive free preschool?** 4-year-olds may attend Little Panther Preschool for a half day or a full day. Half day is tuition free and full day is tuition of \$160.00 per month. Sacred Heart is a full day program and tuition is \$75 per month. All programs run Monday thru Friday with no preschool on Wednesdays.

**Will my four-year-old receive transportation to and from preschool?** The school district may be able to provide free transportation using an existing bus route. Check with your preschool provider for more information.

**Where can I obtain more information about the Statewide Voluntary Preschool Program for Four-Year-Old Children?** You can visit with representatives of the participating preschools and you can visit the Iowa Department of Education web site: <https://educate.iowa.gov/pk-12/early-childhood/swvpp>.

## 2026-2027 Little Panthers Preschool

If you are interested in registering your 4-year old for the Little Panthers Preschool for the 2026-2027 school year, please do so in one of the following ways:

### 1. Download and print the application.

The application is available on our website: [www.monticello.k12.ia.us](http://www.monticello.k12.ia.us), click on the *registration* icon and then *Little Panthers Preschool*. Mail the completed application to Shannon Elementary, 321 W South St. Monticello, IA 52310 or it can be dropped off at Shannon Elementary (office hours are 7:30am-4:00pm).

### 2. Complete the application electronically by clicking on the Little Panthers Preschool Application Link.

The link is located on our website: [www.monticello.k12.ia.us](http://www.monticello.k12.ia.us), click on the *registration* icon and then *Little Panthers Preschool*.

### 3. The application can be picked up at Shannon or mailed to you by calling Shannon Elementary Office at 319-465-3000, press 5 and then 2.

Applications will be available on January 2 and are due February 6. Preschool openings are filled through a lottery method. Head Start slots and Empowerment grants may be available. This preschool is an inclusive, full-day program Monday through Friday with no preschool on Wednesdays for students of all needs. Our program offers:

- A certified teacher & paraprofessional
- Large & small group instruction
- Learning centers
- Developmentally appropriate schedule and activities
- Thematic instruction
- Social skills curriculum
- Snack and milk

## KINDERGARTEN REGISTRATION

Kindergarten registration for the 2026-2027 school year is open! Kindergarten registration is for students entering kindergarten in the Fall of 2026. Kindergarten registration is done all online. You can register on our website at [www.monticello.k12.ia.us](http://www.monticello.k12.ia.us), click on the *registration* icon on the home page and then *kindergarten*. Mandatory forms can also be found on the website. These forms need to be turned in by the first day of school.

Students must turn 5 years of age on or before September 15, 2026 to attend Kindergarten. Contact Morgan Murray-Zimmerman at [morgan.murray@monticello.k12.ia.us](mailto:morgan.murray@monticello.k12.ia.us) with any questions regarding your Parent Infinite Campus account.



Completed immunizations, physical, and a dental exam are required by law for all students entering kindergarten. Some of the series of vaccines take six (6) months to complete. Start now to make sure all needed immunizations are completed before your child starts school in the Fall 2026!

There are some forms that you will need to download, fill out, and turn into Shannon Elementary by the time your child starts school. Forms include: IDPH Dental Screen, IDPH Vision Screen, Iowan Migrant Parents Form (*everyone must fill out*), Home Language Survey, and a physical form with LEAD screening date. These forms are located on the *Kindergarten* page on our [website](#) under *Registration*.

## Should Everyone Go to College?

As with most things in life, there is more than one path to success. College is not for everyone; however, everyone should consider it as one of their many options. Here are post-secondary options that are presented to high school students:

- **College**- a broad term for education after high school (CDL, diploma, certificate, Associate's, Bachelor's, Master's, and other professional degrees)
- **Apprenticeship**- paid to work with benefits while learning job skills
- **Job Corps**- learn job skills and live for free at two locations in Iowa
- **AmeriCorps**- national service organization with education stipend for college
- **Teach for America**- full-time, salaried position with benefits for two years
- **Work**- enter the workforce after graduation. Some students choose a gap year to save money for college and then attend.
- **Military**- service can be active duty or reserves; career-long or one or more enlistments

There are benefits to earning a degree after high school. A study by Georgetown University Center on Education and the Workforce found that Americans with an Associate's (2 year) degree or higher were much less likely to be unemployed. Earning potential tends to be greater with a post-secondary degree. Wonder what is best for your child or how to support them? Talk to their school counselor!

## SENIORS

**Scholarships** are beginning to be posted. They will be posted alphabetically by name of scholarship as we post them. When active, the scholarship name will be turned green. Go to the school's website at [www.monticello.k12.ia.us](http://www.monticello.k12.ia.us) and go to the High School page. Click on the Counseling tab, then click on Scholarships on the right. Scroll to the bottom of the page to navigate the local, regional, and national scholarship tabs. They are also located in your student's Google Classroom.

## **SOPHOMORES & JUNIORS!**

Sophomores and juniors interested in applying to National Honor Society can pick up applications in the HS office starting Monday, February 16. Applications are due back to the office by 3:15 pm Friday, March 6. Applicants must have a 3.5 GPA or higher, and a minimum of 40 documented community service hours.

## Free College Planning

Planning for a career and college, applying for financial aid and mastering your financial situation can be confusing and intimidating. Iowa College Access Network (ICAN) works with Iowa students and families to make the transition after high school as smooth as possible.



You will find valuable information under the "Financial Assistance" section. There is notation about scholarships and grants that outlines different opportunities for scholarships. Also in this section are some helpful hints on filling out application materials for financial assistance. Also look for the listing of national databases where students can search for any type of scholarship imaginable. As students are going through the process of seeking financial assistance, encourage them to keep track of where they are applying and the requirements for each of the scholarships they receive.
